

# **What is the Purpose of the Mesquite Shooters Club?**

The Mesquite Shooters Club is a non profit pistol shooting club that was started for the purpose of bringing together the interested pistol shooters of the Mesquite Nevada area.

The club is incorporated in the State of Nevada in January of 2009, and has an agreement with the City of Mesquite to use the Police Outdoor Pistol Range for scheduled events held by the club. No individual use of the Police Pistol Range is allowed.

The City of Mesquite Police Outdoor Pistol Range is located in Lincoln County at the end of Mesquite Heights Road, to the east of the City Landfill.

The club currently meets at room 26 of the old Mesquite Campus on the second Thursday of the month for a business meeting. The public is welcomed and encouraged to attend. (Because this is a school no guns are allowed at the meeting.)

This is a pistol club not just a gun club.

The pistol club is not a political entity.

The intent of the club is to have shooting events on a regular basis.

The purpose is to teach members of the club about shooting and safety.

The shooting is to be in a controlled situation, and not individual shooting unsupervised.

Pistol owners are encouraged to join the club to learn, safe gun handling, encourage improvement in shooting skills through competition, and to encourage social interaction of club members.

Safe gun handling, and organized shooting events, for the enjoyment of the club members are the goal.

The club goal is to have a shooting event three weekends per month, the first Saturday will be informal practice, the second weekend will be training of some kind, and the third weekend will be a competition of some kind.

The application form for members is intended to find out the shooting interests and skills of the club members.

There are no shooting skills required to be a club member, but adherence to range safety, and match control instructions is essential to shoot in the club matches.

Club membership is open to anyone regardless to race, religion, or sexual orientation.

The police will be receiving a list of club members.
