

## What is the Purpose of the Mesquite Shooters Club?

The Mesquite Shooters Club is a non profit pistol shooting club that was started for the purpose of bringing together the interested pistol shooters of the Mesquite Nevada area.

The club is incorporated in the State of Nevada in January of 2009, and has an agreement with a local developer to use a parcel of land in Arizona as a range. Shooting is during designated club events only no individual use of the Pistol Range is allowed.

Directions to Range:

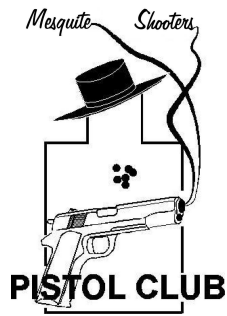
From I-15 Exit 8 in Littlefield AZ drive 1.5 miles southwest on **County Highway 91** to **Hidden Valley Road**, turn left on Hidden Valley Road.

From Mesquite follow **Hillside Drive** to the Arizona border sign. **Hidden Valley Road** is 7.7 miles from the sign. Turn right on Hidden Valley Road. ( TOWARD THE RIVER AWAY FROM THE HIGHWAY) and follow through to the range.

THE ROAD IS PAVED. There are 2 gates which should be open on match days.

If they are shut, you are early and wait for one of us to open them! See attached map.

The club currently meets at range on the first Saturday of the month at 9:00 am before the scheduled shooting event. Shooting events are normally Wednesday and Saturday morning. The public is welcomed and encouraged to attend.



This is a pistol club not just a gun club.

The pistol club is not a political entity.

The intent of the club is to have shooting events on a regular basis.

The purpose is to teach members of the club about shooting and safety.

The shooting is to be in a controlled situation, and not individual shooting unsupervised.

Pistol owners are encouraged to join the club to learn, safe gun handling, encourage improvement in shooting skills through competition, and to encourage social interaction of club members.

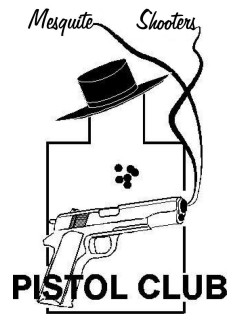
Safe gun handling, and organized shooting events, for the enjoyment of the club members are the goal.

There is a schedule for our shoots. Scheduled events take place on the Wednesday morning and Saturday morning at 9:00.

The application form for members is intended to find out the shooting interests and skills of the club members.

There are no shooting skills required to be a club member, but adherence to range safety, and match control instructions is essential to shoot in the club matches.

Club membership is open to anyone regardless to race, religion, or sexual orientation.
